

OBITUARY.

Mrs. James Trudgett, late of Young died at Manly last week from pneumonic-influenza.

The Rev. A. G. Rix received a wire from Colonel Brown, on Tuesday last. William Lachlan, of Yass, had died of a fractured skull on 11th inst.

Mrs. Hill, relict of the late Mr. Robert Hill (a partner in the firm of Hill and Halls, Grenfell), died at her home at Rose Bay, Sydney, on Easter Monday at the age of 74 years.

The death is announced of Mrs. Elizabeth Lucas, of Yass, at the age of 79 years. Miss Daisy Williams (27), sister of Mrs. F. Semitsky, of Yass, also passed away. Both interments were made in the C. E. cemetery at Yass.

Mrs. Sarah Ann Morris, wife of Mr. Cecil Morris, employed by the railway department in Goulburn, died at her residence, Tailong, about half past seven o'clock on Wednesday morning, aged 46 years, the cause of death being an internal complaint.

Mr. Herbert Cole Charles, the well known rose gardener, died at his residence, "Rosewood," East Goulburn, at 11 o'clock on Saturday morning, the cause of death being an internal complaint. The late Mr. Charles was 51 years of age.

On 14th inst the death occurred at the residence of her son (Mulyan St., Cowra, of Mrs. Sophia Underwood, aged 66 years.

Mr. Charles Plumb, late of Grenfell, and brother of Mr. H. Plumb, of Young, died in Sydney this week.

Mr. James Waldron, associated with Grenfell since early mining days, died on Monday afternoon, after a long and painful illness. Deceased, who was 69 years of age, leaves a widow and family of seven grown up children, one son and daughter having predeceased him. One son (James) served at the front. Mr. Waldron was married in Grenfell to a sister of the late Mr. W. Irwin, another of the early miners on the field, and was brother-in-law to the late Mr. James McGlinchy, and uncle to Messrs J. Still, S. Bembrick, W. Guthrie and others. He was a native of Albury. The funeral, on Tuesday afternoon was largely attended. Rev. Geo. Nesbitt officiated.
