

MRS. H. E. TRUEMAN.

The sad duty devolves upon us this morning of recording the death of Mrs. Trueman, wife of Mr. Harry Edward Trueman, of Moulder-st, this town. The circumstances are particularly pathetic and painful to dwell upon. Mrs. Trueman expired somewhat suddenly yesterday morning, the immediate cause of death being heart failure, supervening upon confinement. It was thought that Mrs. Trueman was making satisfactory progress, and nothing occurred to create misgiving till yesterday morning at 5 o'clock, when the members of the family were summoned to the bedside. Alarming symptoms were in evidence, and the patient succumbed ten minutes later. When the intelligence spread a very painful feeling was created, and the deepest sympathy is expressed for the bereaved husband and little ones. Mr. Trueman is a well-known engine-driver on the railway. His co-workers will feel deeply with him in the peculiarly sore trial. The family have resided in Orange for a period extending over ten years, and are held in high respect and esteem. The pathetic event has cast its gloom over the whole town. We can but trust that Time, the Great Healer will soften the heavy blow which has thus ruthlessly fallen upon the family. The deceased lady was 41 years of age. With the husband

41 years of age. With the husband, five children deplore the loss of a fond, devoted mother, including an infant but a few days old. The names of the children are Benjamin, Raymond, Alice Mary, Lillian Gladys, and Arthur Norman. The deceased was born at Currajong, in the Richmond district. In addition to the foregoing two sisters and four brothers are among the bereaved ones. We condole with the sorrowing ones, and trust that a ray of the Divine love and mercy may lighten the gloom. The funeral takes place to-day, the cortege leaving deceased's late residence for the Church of England section of the Orange Cemetery. Mr. F. Ford has charge of the mortuary arrangements.
